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BACKGROUND AND EXPERIENCE

Aretés is a private research center established in Modena (IT) in 1999 by a group of sociologists and economists. The center focuses on social innovation, quality of life, local development, and European projects. Over the years, Aretés has grown into a significant entity in applied research, European planning, and digital training.

From the beginning, Aretés has been involved in developing European organizational models and infrastructure for local authorities, either directly or through its partners. Initially, the center worked on European design related to education, social issues, employment, and local development.

Aretés has carried out numerous researches at a local, national and European level, collaborating with Municipalities, Unions of Municipalities, Provinces, Regions, Health Authorities and Voluntary Service Centres. The company also carries out research, consultancy and market surveys for private and non-profit organizations. In his twenty years of experience,

Aretés has collaborated in the development of countless European projects within three distinct past European programs, as well as the current one (2021-2027) based on direct programs (e.g. Erasmus +, Fundamental rights and citizenship, Europe for citizens), on structural funds (ESF) and on Interreg or European territorial cooperation programs (Central Europe, IPA CBC Italy-Albania-Montenegro). Lately, he has also focused his attention on the PNRR (National Recovery and Resilience Plan).

Aretés has spearheaded numerous projects focusing on education and social integration, showcasing its leadership in developing innovative methodologies and tools. For instance, one project aimed to facilitate job placement by designing teaching methodologies and assessment tools for adult transversal skills. Another initiative focused on promoting the integration of second-generation young foreigners through a social network and gamification tools. Currently, Aretés is coordinating the design of methodologies to promote equal opportunities and smartphone usage in educational settings across European countries. These endeavours have been recognized for their significant impact on skill development, behavioural changes, and the cultivation of business-related competencies, positioning Aretés as a key player in driving positive social change through education.

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KEY RELEVANT ACTIVITIES

1. Digital Education and Innovative Learning Methodologies

Aretés has a consolidated expertise in digital education and in the application of innovative teaching methods across formal and non-formal settings. Key relevant activities include:

- Development of gamified and competency-based assessment tools for learners and educators.
- Use of participatory methods such as Learning by Doing, Media Education, and Market Research in educational settings.
- Design and delivery of structured digital curricula tailored to specific audiences (e.g., VET learners, teachers, disadvantaged groups).

2. Youth Empowerment, Citizenship and Inclusion

Aretés is strongly engaged in projects that promote active youth participation, intercultural dialogue, and inclusion. Relevant initiatives include:

- IT'S YOU, supporting intercultural education for youth workers and young people with migrant backgrounds.
- HEY PEOPLE!, tackling gender stereotypes in career choices through awareness-raising and educational activities.
- Development of tailored training programs on communication, soft skills, and active citizenship for young people.
- Involvement of youth and local communities in participatory processes to co-design social impact projects.

3. Social Innovation and Digital Inclusion for Disadvantaged Groups

Aretés focuses on reducing inequalities through digital education and social innovation. Core activities include:

- Training programs for seniors and volunteers, promoting digital literacy to counteract social isolation.
- Community engagement strategies that mobilize tech-savvy individuals to support local initiatives.
- Collaboration with psychologists, educators, and aging professionals to ensure inclusive and accessible training approaches.
- Projects targeting digital inclusion for migrants and vulnerable adults, integrating social and digital empowerment.
- Design of learning tools adapted to the needs of underrepresented groups in educational systems.

4. European Project Design and Capacity Building

Aretés has extensive experience in coordinating and participating in EU-funded projects with a strategic focus on long-term impact. Key capacities include:

- Successful coordination of Erasmus+ KA2 projects in school education, youth, and adult learning.
